A Message from the President



Since 1913 Evangel Hall Mission has been a Christian presence in Toronto's core seeking to serve and create a community among poor, homeless, and socially isolated people. Through the residence and drop-in centre programmes, Evangel Hall Mission has evolved from a small soup kitchen to become a valued and respected housing provider and advocacy agency in Ontario.

The guests and residents of the Mission are remarkable people. In spite of the considerable physical, mental, spiritual, and social obstacles face with it is their stories which make the Mission a place of healing, redemption, restoration, and grace.

This has been another year of growth at Evangel Hall. Youth and adult programmes continue to expand and projects continue to evolve to meet growing and emerging needs. The Mission hosts Out Of The Cold programmes twice a week, encourages and supports women's and men's life skill programmes and bible studies, finds housing and services for people who are so often forgotten and ignored. Nourishing meals are always available and the spiritual life at the Mission is rich and has been enhanced by a new chapel.

Now that the dream Evangel Hall Mission had of providing affordable housing in downtown Toronto has been realized the staff and Board of the Hall have set their sights on new projects. In partnership with a generous donor the Hall has begun renovations to create a medical and dental clinic in the basement of our new premises. Soon volunteer dentists and medical staff will provide health care for people who regularly go without.

Evangel Hall Mission has a dramatic impact on people's lives. God's Kingdom is evident at the Mission through the tireless dedication and commitment of countless volunteers, a professional and caring staff, dedicated Board members, and the prayerful and faithful support of donors and Presbyterian congregations across the country.

Community Outreach

The EHM drop-in centre continues to expand to meet the growing needs of our participants and community. We provide a safe refuge for people to gather where they always feeling welcome and at home. Over the past year we have seen many changes which have made a positive impact on people's lives.

- We have resumed our employment program through volunteer, Dan Armishaw and our student interns.
- The community thrift shop has been moved downstairs to make room for our expanding youth programs.
- The high cost of laundry is a concern for many people who live on the streets. To meet this need, a full service laundry area is available throughout the morning drop-in centre.
- A weekly bible study which is led by Rev. Robert Anderson.
- Our community BBQ has grown from what was an in-house get-together into a community event . Last year, volunteers from the TD Bank and Factory Theater came together to help serve as well as co-host the event.
- Our youth programs have also expanded to include the boys and girls after-school programs and homework club.
- The program had another successful Outside the Lines Summer Camp for teenage girl and youth performed an original theatre production in collaboration with the Cobblestone Theatre Drama Group.



Our Volunteer Program

Over the past year we have seen our Volunteer Program expand to meet the growing needs of our community programs. We have since seen a rise in groups becoming engaged and eager to help where they can. The aim is to inspire and engage everyone who come through our doors to help.

Our participant volunteer program also continues to grow with men and women developing their skills and giving back to their community. EHM volunteers are people from all walks of life who have come together to make a positive difference by sharing their experience and time with those in our community who need it most. Behind every one of our successful programs you will find twice as many compassionate dedicated volunteers willing and eager to serve.

Thank you to the many volunteers who help with the running of our drop-in program, community dinners, clothing bank, youth programs, annual canned food drive and annual golf tournament. Your service inspires us all.



The Hall has many programs...

- We serve 150 people in our daily drop-in program
- Serve hundreds of meals a week with our food program and community dinners
- Provide Alcoholics and Narcotics Anonymous programs
- House 130 people in fully furnished affordable housing units with full tenant support
- Help to meet the spiritual and emotional needs with counselling and Sunday worship services
- Host Out-of-the-Cold program in the Winter and extended weekend drop-in hours

Health and Dental Care in Marginalized Communities

Members of the EHM community face and present significant challenges in both the traditional health and dental care system. They often require a broader, integrated case management approach that considers emotional, spiritual and physical needs. This is more than traditional care providers can usually provide. At least 50% of community members do not have adequate health and dental care and suffer for it.

Medical Care:

Issues such as homelessness, insufficient life skills, emotional and mental health illnesses and addictions are all important determinants of health and affect the majority of EHM's community members. These issues can cause or exacerbate acute and chronic medical conditions and need to be addressed when creating sustainable, long-term healthcare.

Through our wide range of services, ranging from food service to financial trusteeship, clothing provision to housing assistance, EHM offers very holistic help for our participants and residents. The addition of on-site medical care will build upon this firm foundation of effective support.

Oral Health:

Good oral health is clearly important to a person's quality of life. Oral pain, missing teeth or infections can influence the way a person speaks, eats and socializes. These oral health problems can reduce a person's quality of life by affecting their physical, mental and social well-being. Oral disease, like any other disease, needs to be treated. (Source: Canadian Dental Association)

The cost of dental fees alone creates a significant barrier for people living on limited incomes. While some social assistance is available for dental work, it is minimal. Financial assistance for people between the ages of 18 and 55 is particularly limited.

People who are homeless or living with mental health issues face additional barriers to accessing proper dental care: social isolation and lack of life skills. Individuals living on the streets or exhibiting obvious mental health issues are often not welcomed in private dental clinics or have a fear of institutions. These individuals may also lack the resources or skills to set up appointments and fulfill them without assistance.

Being part of the solution – Building a free, community medical clinic

In its new community clinic, Evangel Hall Mission will provide free and accessible dental care and primary medical care. Two dental suites and a medical office are currently being constructed. The clinic is scheduled to open in the Summer of 2008. For more information, please visit our website.

Our Residence

Since the opening of our new residence, we have seen improvement in so many people's lives. A safe place to call home is critical for someone to lead a happy and fulfilling life. Unfortunately we have seen time and time again what happens when a person does not have access to housing. People become vulnerable to so many life threatening situations, addiction and mental illness. It makes many feel helpless and alone.

We have made sure to not only provide safe, clean and affordable apartments, but also give our residents access to our various drop-in programs and new resident programs as well.

Last year we added the Community Kitchen Program. Through guidance and education, we want to teach others how to make healthier food choices, manage special dietary needs and prepare low-cost, nutritious meals. We can build people's abilities to live healthier lives.

The program was initiated with the help of GreenShield Canada Foundation and FoodShare, an agency that works with communities to ensure that everyone has sustainably produced, healthy food.

We have also created a community garden project in which residents, participants and other members of our community will plant and grow food and greenery. Youth from Covenant House will spend time at EHM to assist with the project, developing team work and employability skills.



You Can Help

We envision so many ways we can help our community with our new facility. The possibilities are only limited by our imaginations. Campaign Dignity is your opportunity to be a part of this exciting expansion. It is your opportunity to reach out in partnership and support. EHM still has \$5 million to raise to eliminate the \$3.75 million RBC mortgage and \$1.95 million loan from City of Toronto increased to build our new home. Annual operating fundraising needs have increased 15% since last year, a forecasted increase, in order to accommodate the expanded operations. Please help us make our visions a reality!

Profiles of Growth and Change

Harry and His Mother

Last summer, Harry and his mother came to live at Evangel Hall shortly after Harry was admitted to Sick Kids Hospital. Worried about Harry's future, staff and his mother did not know what to do.

They were then living in a dirty, insect-infested rooming house, feeling dispossessed from their community. Concerned about the impact these poor living conditions were having on Harry's health, the staff of the Hospital for Sick Children contacted Evangel Hall Mission. It was crucial that this family find a suitable place to live.

"Staff at Evangel Hall understood the seriousness of their housing situation and immediately stepped into help when no one else would. You did so with genuine warmth, approachability and caring. It was a pleasure meeting such a committed and professional group of individuals." Social worker, HSC. Now mother and son are happy living in their clean, safe and affordable apartment. This has drastically improved Harry's quality of life. "We have so much less to worry about, says Xiao Ling." My son has a future and is very happy. Everywhere we turn here, there is somebody always willing to help."

Last summer our staff to helped Harry attend music camp, and he is a regular participant of the afterschool homework club. We are happy to have Harry and his mother as new residents.

Paul's Story

Paul and his long-term friend Sheila spent over a year documenting Paul's experiences and reflections on how difficult it can be having to rely on the government while living on disability assistance. It was later broadcast on CBC Radio One.

"I hope it will make a difference in educating people on the barriers that exist out there," he says. "People tend to identify with personal stories, which have far more impact than the words of a politician or activist."

Paul suffers from a degenerative bone disease which has placed many limitations of his life, both physically and financially. Before he came to live at Evangel Hall Mission, Paul's living conditions were becoming unlivable, as he had to climb 2 flights of stairs using two canes. It was becoming increasingly painful as was the stress of not knowing where to find his next meal.

It was in search of food where Paul came to learn of Evangel Hall Mission. When he walked through our doors, his life was dramatically improved. He now has a new home and full support for his disability.

"What happens here is special," he says. "Evangel Hall is doing what the government will not do in regards to housing and support. It is good to know that the Presbyterian church and EHM supporters care enough to build this place."
