HOW YOUR SUPPORT HELPED IN 2016-17







"Every week I bake 11 dozen muffins in my home, bring them to ehm, and serve them along with the hot breakfast ehm offers to guests at the Drop-In Centre. I lost my dad when I was five years old and unfortunately, I know what it's like to live in poverty. While I don't know what challenges the guests at ehm's Drop-In Centre are living with, I do know that many have endured great hardship. And while a muffin won't make that go away, it's a small part of ehm's bigger effort to create safe space."



HOMELESSNESS

ehm offers a safe space, support services, and community to individuals who are homeless or who may be living in unstable conditions. Last year alone, your support provided:

- Over 100,000 meals to people who had no other means of eating.
- 660 shelter bed nights at ehm through the Out of the Cold Program.
- 43 people with help to manage their income through the Financial Trust Program. Many were able to save money for things such as first and last month's rent to get an apartment.

HOUSING

Through ehm's Housing Programs, you helped those in need to access safe, stable and affordable housing. Because of you:

- 6 new tenants moved off the street or out of unstable housing, and into the ehm residence. Support staff helped tenants to receive health care, reduced social isolation by hosting weekly social activities, and coached clients as they learned new skills and took on new responsibilities, such as grocery shopping, cooking, and paying bills — all essential for maintaining housing.
- Housing advocates in the Drop-In Centre met with clients over 830 times last year. They work with a client for as long as it takes to help them get into stable housing.

HEALTH

ehm's Health Programs offer support to improve the physical and mental wellness of those most in need. Providing an important link between local health care teams and clients, clients are supported in seeking health care, and receive encouragement to stick to their health care plan. Our Spiritual Care Program is there for people when they are most vulnerable, and helps clients get through the hardest moments.

- 160 new patients visited the Dental Clinic. Many of them were seeing a dentist or dental hygienist for the first time in decades.
- Clients took 2,765 showers, and were given soap, shampoo, razors, toothbrushes and toothpaste.
- 65 students received bus tickets and other support to help them stay in school and have more choices.

ROOTS & ROOTS & ROOTS

But thanks to people like you, Barbara knew Jonathan, ehm's Spiritual Care Worker. And rather than face the fear of going to the funeral alone, she asked Jonathan to attend with her.


