OUR SERVICE MODEL

Our services are built around **three pillars of care: homelessness, housing, and health.** We take a holistic, 360-degree approach to wellness, looking at the needs of body, mind, and spirit.

We journey with our community members, providing daily basic necessities, on-going emotional and spiritual supports, and access to life-changing housing and employment opportunities. Most importantly, staff, volunteers, participants, and residents alike create a safe community based on the principles of compassion, non-judgmental love, and respect.

Here, people facing challenges of poverty, homelessness, substance abuse, mental and physical health issues, can forge healthy relationships, develop life-affirming skills, and work towards brighter, happier futures.

WHAT YOU CAN FIND AT 552 ADELAIDE STREET WEST

The Adult Drop-In: This is the hub for our many community programs that are open to any individual in need of assistance. Open 7 days a week, people can access:

- Basic necessities of food, clothes, bathing and laundry facilities
- Individual supports such as housing search assistance, financial trusteeship, and pastoral care
- Social supports such as the men's, women's, and creative arts groups
- Physical health supports such as the Dental Clinic and community nurses
- Weekly community meals, Sunday worship, and the Out of the Cold emergency shelter

The ehm Residence: We typically have 110 residents with a mix of singles and families. The 6th floor kitchen and rooftop patio are communal spaces to gather, enjoy a meal, and share skills and interests.

Support Teams: Our Client Care, Tenant Support, and Spiritual Care Workers help residents and Drop-In members alike in a myriad of ways. Whether helping new residents use the public transit and navigate their new surroundings, walking with a client to view a nearby rental apartment to secure housing, or organizing a memorial service to honour a loved one, our support staff are dedicated to walking alongside our residents and participants in their journeys to healthier futures.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS FOR 2018

- An innovative solution kept a resident housed as they struggled with mental health issues. Their symptoms of mental illness continuously disturbed the neighbours, making it difficult for the others to sleep. Taking an eviction-prevention approach, staff worked with the City of Toronto to soundproof the unit and keep the resident in their home.
- Space and support was provided to community partners to deliver ID clinics, public health nurse services, addictions treatment supports, legal clinics, a diabetes prevention workshop, Hepatitis C screenings, flu shots, and healthy cooking classes.
- ehm extended its Out of the Cold program by four weeks. During the 2017-2018 winter, 750 emergency shelter beds were provided to our most vulnerable neighbours.
- The Drop-In became more accessible through a Government of Canada grant to install automatic doors, and an Ontario Trillium Foundation grant to repair the walkway and driveway.

HOW YOUR SUPPORT HELPED CHANGE LIVES

Your support is making a difference through ehm's three pillars of care: homelessness, housing, and health.



HOMELESSNESS: ehm offers a safe space and support services to individuals who are homeless or who may be living in unstable conditions. Last year:

39,506 visits were made to the Drop-In Centre

100,000 nutritious meals were served to people who might have otherwise gone hungry

40 clients had help managing their money as part of the Financial Trustee Program, helping them to pay their bills, and to save money for first and last month's rent



HOUSING: ehm helps those in need to access safe, stable, and affordable housing. Because of you:

103 new clients received housing supports

110 tenants called the ehm Residence home



HEALTH: ehm offers wellness supports, makes referrals to health care professionals, and operates a free dental clinic for low-income individuals and families.

Your support provided:

710 preventative and emergency dental care visits

489 visits to the Men's Group, 226 visits to the Women's Group, and 215 visits to the Creative Group






