The ehm Residence is a place where people can flourish. Relieved of the all-encompassing worry of whether they will make next month's rent, residents are able to direct their energy towards living full lives and pursuing their interests.

Khadijah is one such resident. Since moving in eight years ago, she started a degree at OCAD University (Ontario College of Art & Design University), pursuing a lifelong dream of becoming a professional artist. "It's been a safe haven for me," Khadijah reflects. "When I moved here, I had nowhere to go. [The Residence] is really good, because it's suited for my income. It's forgiving in the sense that it's adjusted to whatever I make and I have time to collect enough money to pay for my rent. It allows me a sort of breather."

With this sense of security, Khadijah has developed her art, creating stunning works that explore and express her identity.

Creating artwork is an integral part of Khadijah's life, bringing her joy in the middle of sometimes difficult circumstances: "It really helped me learn a lot about myself and the world. With my circumstances, it's one thing that gives me joy."

Khadijah's artwork and home studio in the Residence, where she's been creating her art since the beginning of the pandemic, were highlighted in CBC Arts this summer.

SOLVING TORONTO'S HOMELESSNESS & HOUSING CRISIS

The COVID-19 pandemic has starkly shown the extent of Toronto's housing crisis, revealing the critical need for long-term solutions to homelessness. Tackling homelessness ultimately means increasing affordable housing, such as the rent-geared-to-income housing we offer in the ehm Residence.

The good news is that the pandemic has been a catalyst for leaders at all levels of government to pay closer attention to the housing crisis. This fall, both the City of Toronto and the federal government announced plans to increase affordable housing. These plans include engaging community stakeholders to create housing solutions.

We know that you, our supporters, are invested in solving the homelessness and housing crisis. We look forward to sharing more news with you about how affordable housing is being created and how you can be part of the solution. "Simply put, it is now... more cost effective to build and acquire supportive housing than it is to build and operate more shelters. What you have here is a clear moral case to act, which we have always had, together with a solid business case for doing it."

- Take-Out Meal Program increases to five days per week, distributing 200 meals each day
- Financial trustee, spiritual care, tenant support workers continue to provide supports remotely, including teaching computer/internet skills
